# **First Aid Responders**

A Professional Plating has a long-standing commitment to provide a clean and safe environment for our Team and we are proud of our safety statistics. However, not all medical issues are workplace-injury related. Personal health issues can occur to a member of our Team at any time, and we need to be prepared to provide immediate assistance.

In April, we partnered with Gold Cross Ambulance Services to conduct our bi-annual certified safety training to several of our Team Members. The video-based, instructor-led course teaches critical skills needed to respond to and manage a first aid, choking or sudden cardiac arrest emergency in the first few minutes until emergency medical services arrive.
