## **Here We Grow Again!**

It was just one year ago that we were in the final stages of installing our latest zinc rack plating machine, Rack 6. That machine became operational in July 2022 and the older machine that it replaced has since been removed.

So it's time...Here We Grow Again! In March, the Endries family, owners of Professional Plating, approved an investment of over \$4 million for the purchase and installation of a new Barrel Zinc Plating machine that is planned to be on line by the end of 2023.

This new machine will allow us added zinc barrel plating capacity to continue to serve the needs of our existing customers, and opens the door to potential new business that we were not able to previously take on.





A quick tutorial for those not familiar with barrel plating. As the name implies, barrel plating entails placing the parts inside a barrel typically constructed of polypropylene with small holes for drainage of solution. The barrel contains center bars that conduct the electrical current. The barrel rotates slowly while immersed in the electrolytic plating solution.
