One of the initiatives that is offered to Professional Plating Team Members is the free use of our well-equipped fitness center versus them spending hard-earned dollars on a gym membership. ## **Disaster Relief**

A true treasure in the Brillion community is a thrift store appropriately named "Hidden Treasurers". It is very comforting to know that when items are donated to a second-hand store, the money that is collected from the sale of those items, is donated both locally such as to the volunteer fire department and Lions Club, and to various humanitarian efforts. That is the ongoing mission of the Hidden Treasurers Thrift Shoppe.

In October, the board members at Hidden Treasurers wanted to assist the American Red Cross' efforts to support those affected by Hurricanes Helene and Milton. They announced that they would match up to \$10,000 from their sales. Due to the immense need for assistance, they took their plan one step further, inviting businesses, churches and civic organizations in the community to join in.



A \$10,000 match from Professional Plating's charitable fund was also announced, along with matches from several other businesses. In a very short amount of time, the Brillion community was proud to collect \$75,000 to send to the disaster relief efforts!
